



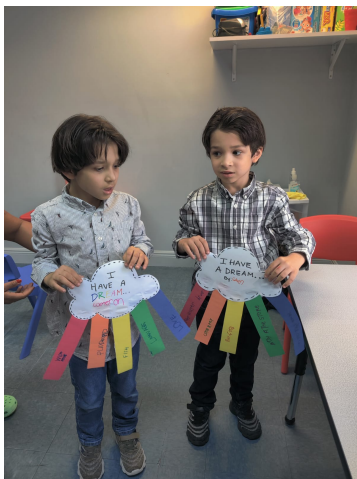

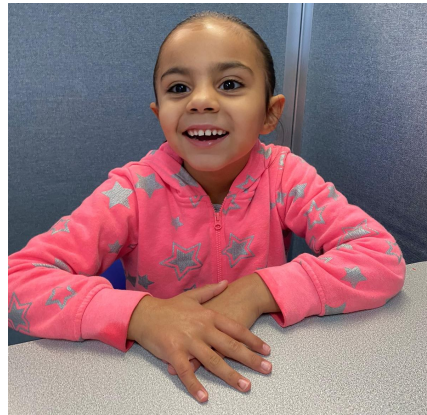
by responding to a short writing prompt related to their dreams of the
